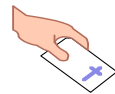

WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

Believe in Purgatory

Imagine pounding a nail into a board, then removing the nail. Even after the nail is gone, the nail-hole remains. In this example, our soul is the board, the nail is sin, and the hole that remains is the reason we need purgatory.

Well before the time of Christ, Jewish people prayed for the dead, and they continue that practice to this day. Jesus and his Apostles, all devout Jews, carried on the belief expressed in Maccabees: "Turning to supplication, they prayed that the sinful deed might be fully blotted out" (12:42) and "Thus, [Judas Maccabees] made atonement for the dead that they might be freed from the sin" (12:46). From the beginning, the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers for them.

In paragraph 1030-31, the Catechism of the Catholic Church says, "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are assured of their eternal salvation; but after death, they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. The Church gives the name *Purgatory* to this final purification".

Purgatory is the process of "filling the holes" of our sins so that our souls may be presented to God in Heaven wholly, purely, and without blemish.

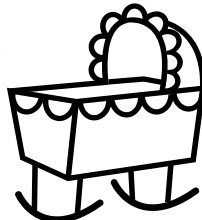

First time participants must complete the 8 Hour Course (\$20 fee), to receive the 10% discount, and then the 4 Hour Refresher (\$18 fee) every three years to maintain the discount.
