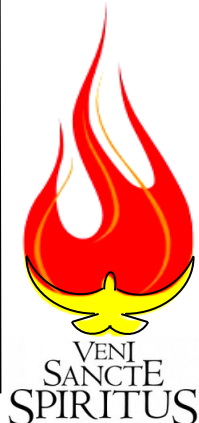

Thanks to all of you faithful workers out there who volunteered time and energy at the Walker Area Food Shelf four Tuesdays in May: Doug Aird, Mike Becker, Nan Blom, Jerry Bryant, Steve Cashman, Betty & Dick Strub, Harriet Nerad, Jean & Gary Weber. Ten thousand sixteen pounds of food (yes, 10016 lbs.) was distributed to 144 families. October is our next month to work. Mark your calendar.

During the recent 2011 March Campaign Fund Raiser, monetary contributions from Sacred Heart/St.Agnes were \$1480 (\$2285 last year). Contributions from churches, organizations, businesses and individuals in the Walker/Hackensack area totaled \$27,002.66, down nearly seven thousand dollars from 2010. WHY DO CATHOLICS CELEBRATE PENTECOST?

Pentecost, the 50th and final day of the Easter Season, celebrates the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles in the book of Acts, ushering in the beginning of the Church. Fifty Days after Jesus' resurrection (and 10 days after Jesus' Ascension), the apostles were gathered together, probably confused and contemplating their future mission and purpose. On the day of Pentecost, a flame rested upon the apostles and they began to speak in tongues (languages), by the power of the Holy Spirit. Thus Pentecost is a time for many Catholics and other Christians to celebrate two important realities: the Holy Spirit and the Church.

Pentecost has long been a very important feast in the Roman Catholic and Orthodox Churches because it celebrates the official beginning of the Church. It is one of the twelve Great Feasts of the Eastern Church, second only in importance to Pascha (Easter). The summer season of Ordinary Time begins on the Monday immediately following Pentecost Sunday.

The Church of God, which began on Pentecost (Acts 2), is given the mission of preaching the good news of the Kingdom of God in preparation for the next step in God's plan, the return of Jesus Christ.

Pope Benedict XVI explained the link between the Spirit and the Eucharist, which is the Source and Summit of our lives, by saying:

"The Paraclete (Holy Spirit), Christ's first gift to those who believe, already at work in Creation (cf. Gen 1:2), is fully present throughout the life of the incarnate Word: Jesus Christ is conceived by the Virgin Mary by the power of the Holy Spirit (cf. Mt 1:18; Lk 1:35); at the beginning of his public mission, on the banks of the Jordan, he sees the Spirit descend upon him in the form of a dove (cf. Mt 3:16 and parallels); he acts, speaks and rejoices in the Spirit (cf. Lk 10:21), and he can offer himself in the Spirit (cf. Heb 9:14).

In the so-called "farewell discourse" reported by John, Jesus clearly relates the gift of his life in the paschal mystery to the gift of the Spirit to his own (cf. Jn 16:7). Once risen, bearing in his flesh the signs of the passion, he can pour out the Spirit upon them (cf. Jn 20:22), making them sharers in his own mission (cf. Jn 20:21). The Spirit would then teach the disciples all things and bring to their remembrance all that Christ had said (cf. Jn 14:26), since it falls to him, as the Spirit of truth (cf. Jn 15:26), to guide the disciples into all truth (cf. Jn 16:13).

In the account in Acts, the Spirit descends on the Apostles gathered in prayer with Mary on the day of Pentecost (cf. 2:1-4) and stirs them to undertake the mission of proclaiming the Good News to all peoples. Thus it is through the working of the Spirit that Christ himself continues to be present and active in his Church, starting with her vital center which is the Eucharist. Against this backdrop we can understand the decisive role played by the Holy Spirit in the Eucharistic celebration, particularly with regard to transubstantiation."

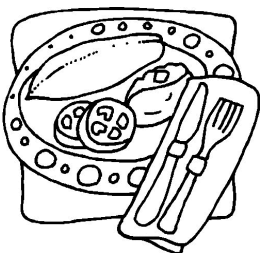

A NOTE FROM FATHER FRANCIS

Dear Parishioners,

Happy Pentecost to everyone! Pentecost Sunday is regarded as the 'Birth-day' of the Church. It is after the out pouring of the Holy Spirit among the disciples of Jesus that they were able to shed off their fears and started spreading the Gospel to all the nations. That same Holy Spirit has guided the Church throughout centuries, even when the humanness of the Church at times has been weak. The Divine presence of the Holy Spirit with all its *charisma* (any good gift that flows from God's benevolent love (*charis*) unto man) has left the Church intact, despite some disunity that we all need to work harder to repair, from inner purification, through the mercy of God. What a blessing we have in the Church! Each person has a share of this Spirit, manifested within each one of us so differently and that is the joy of experiencing **unity in diversity**. May we all strive to rediscover our own charisma and continue to spread the Gospel without fear, realizing within the Church we **never take way**, rather we **enrich** each other through this same Holy Spirit, where Christ is the vine and we are the branches. Speaking of charisma, there are opportunities within our region lined up for any one interested to participate in some manifest of the Spirit, organized by Our Lady of the Pines Catholic Church in Nevis, which is hosting Mr. Brendan Case -"a Lay Evangelist" from Arizona who once ministered a retreat at St Agnes. Also the Magnificat group within our clustered Churches here have organized two "Praise & Worship Workshops" on June 20th-21st at St Agnes Church featuring Susan Potvin from Steubenville. More information is in the bulletin and all are welcome to participate.

On another note, I just want to report that we have now met for the 3rd time with other parishes within the Brainerd Deanery on **Diocesan Strategic Planning**. In this bulletin, you will find a letter from the bishop explaining further what this process is all about and how it is progressing. So far, our meetings have been going on well, of course not without some constructive engaging discussions, bearing in mind we are dealing with people's life-long houses of worship. There are several suggestions that have been floated in these meetings that in one way or another will affect us, although not in bigger ways that few other parishes are expecting to effect , but will demand that we do some adjustments. In our Pastoral Council meeting, we will be sharing more in detail of these suggestions, but so far there are no major proposals in comparison with what other Churches within our deanery have been asked to do. Again, nothing is finalized yet, but we hope the Holy Spirit, as the Bishop remind us in his letter, will continue to guide the process in **discerning God's will** for the future of the People of God in Northern Minnesota.

Finally, I would like to **thank everyone** who is participating in the Moto Hope Mission Kenyan Dinners. St. Agnes expected, as write this column, more than 120 people who had confirmed attendance to enjoy (hopefully) my native regular in the meal. I'm so gratified that many of you are showing interest in this mission. Below, you'll find a letter of support from our Bishop Sirba that he wrote to the entire Volunteer committee of Moto Hope Mission (whom I am so thankful for their commitment to lead this effort), in which he summarizes what kind of impact these types of missions can have to each one of us. I have a passion for education as some of you know, as I have seen growing up, it's the major key to breaking the poverty cycle in the family. **Reaching out** and **Empowering** the young people and women in my village through this mission, to me is worth an effort in giving them and generations to come a better life though education. I definitely can't do it alone and that is where I reach out to all of you, in which ever way you can, especially through **prayers**, to consider supporting this mission. As I said in my introductory note, within the Church, you **never take away** from anyone, rather you **enrich each other**, as the Lord is the giver of all and His **Fountain of Goodness** never dries out!
