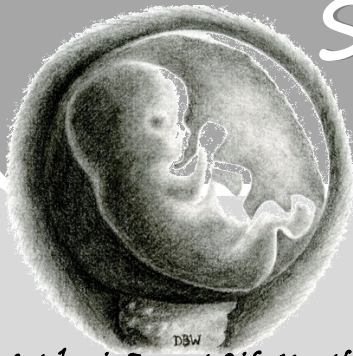

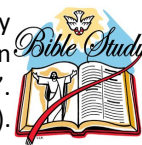

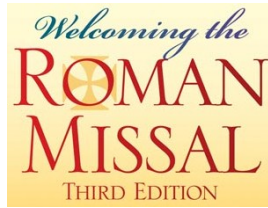

A NOTE FROM FATHER FRANCIS

Dear Parishioners,

Over the past several months, you may have noticed the “Praying the Mass Anew” inserts in our parish bulletin and other mentions of the New Translation of the Mass. Catholics in all English-speaking parts of the world will be implementing the Third Edition of the Roman Missal on the First Sunday of Advent (November 27th).



Pope John Paul II announced that the Church would begin the process of improving the Roman Missal during the Jubilee Year 2000. Among other things, the revised edition of the Roman Missal contains prayers for the observances of recently canonized saints, prefaces for the Eucharistic Prayers, special Masses and Prayers for Various Needs and Occasions, and some updated and revised rubrics (instructions) for the celebration of the Mass. The English translation of the Roman Missal will also include updated translations of existing prayers, including some of the responses and acclamations of the people.

With the wording changes of the new translation, many of the Mass parts which we sing weekly, including the Gloria, Holy, Holy, and Lamb of God, will be changing. To help us get ready for these changes, our choirs will be leading us in learning the wording and tunes for the newly revised parts. All are invited to come about 10 minutes early for Masses over the next 8 weeks as we practice and prepare for the changes to our Sacred Liturgy. **Thanks to our organists and choir members** who’ve been working hard to get ready for this wonderful transition!

Today’s “Praying the Mass Anew” insert, entitled “Professing our Faith”, will expand even more on what Fr. John Paul Erickson (who we are grateful for his traveling to be with us this weekend!) is talking about at our Masses this weekend. Have you ever wondered if we have a brief summary of our beliefs? The Creed has always served as such a summary. Today’s insert speaks particularly of the origins and new translation of “Niceno-Constantinopolitan Creed” that we typically use to profess our faith at Mass, and how it brings together our beliefs in one statement. **Please take time to read this important insert.**



Another way our parish is preparing for the new translation of the Roman Missal is by encouraging all parishioners to attend one of the “Biblical Walk Through the Mass” study groups that we have beginning this month. We are looking for additional people who may be interested in co-leading a group. If you are interested in helping out, there will be a meeting this Thursday at 8:30am at St. Agnes. Watch for an insert in next weekend’s bulletin on times this 4-week study will be offered.
